Important New Information for MaineHealth Physicians

Medicare Advisory: Physician Face-to-Face Encounters With Home Health Patients

Issue Briefing: December 2010

In accordance with the Affordable Care Act, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services issued its final regulation, which requires home health patients to have a physician face-to-face encounter prior to the certification of need for services. Effective January 1, 2011, the face-to-face encounter must occur 90 days prior to or within 30 days after the start of home health services.

A nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist or physician's assistant may carry out the face-to-face encounter; however, their clinical findings must be communicated to the physician certifying home healthcare.

Only the physician can order home health services, certify that a face-to-face encounter occurred, document that other eligibility criteria are met (medical necessity and homebound status), and verify both the face-to-face certification statement and the home health plan of care with a signature and date.

When the patient is being discharged from an inpatient facility setting, the inpatient facility physician is allowed to sign and date the face-to-face encounter statement.

*** Home health agencies will no longer be allowed to date-stamp receipt of orders. Physicians are required by Medicare to date in writing both the certification statement and the plan of care. *** The face-to-face encounter must be

- made by the physician responsible for certifying home health (or nonphysician practitioner as described above);
- related to the primary reason for which the patient requires home health services; and
- completed 90 days prior to or within 30 days after the start of home health services.

The responsible physician (and **NOT** the nonphysician practitioner) must document this face-to-face encounter on the home health plan of care or on the plan of care addendum that is provided by the home health agency.

Documentation for certifying face-to-face encounters must include the following:

- Encounter date
- Indication that encounter was related to the primary reason for home health services
- Explanation of why the clinical findings of the encounter support the need for skilled nursing or therapy services
- Explanation of why the clinical findings of the encounter support the patient's homebound status
- Physician signature and date
